BCEF is awarded a Clay Electric Grant for \$20,000



Cheryl has been busy applying for Operation Roundup grants this year. Through Altrusa, they received a grant for \$10,000 for the UFLI program for K-2nd graders that focuses on literacy January. Then, through Kiwanis, they received another \$10,000 grant for Math Manipulatives and Science Consumables in February. Because BCEF had received a grant last year, the final report was submitted in November, and we had to wait until February, (one year from the time we received the last one), to apply again. Clay Electric did not meet in March because a quorum wasn't available to meet, so they met in April. It was worth the wait!! We received notice that we were awarded the full \$20,000 for our Book Sets for K-12th grade. Clay Electric increased their maximum funding to \$20,000 in November of 2022. This project will allow students to read and study the same book in a classroom setting. The books will also have an emphasis on History and Civics. Civics is an area that Governor DeSantis has been proactive about, and we hope to get the High School to form a competitive team for this area in the future. Funding should be received in May, and we have a year to complete the project. A special thank you to our Assistant Superintendent, Karen Clark for coming up with this excellent suggestions for these projects!
